- Virginia Cooperative Extension Hops Publications: These include factsheets, pest management guides, Virginia grower survey results, and more.
- Hops Analysis from the Virginia Tech Enology Analytical Services Laboratory: The lab can report on moisture, acids, and essential oils from hop samples submitted.
- **Soil Testing:** Samples submitted to Virginia Tech with the crop code for hops (code 75) will return with fertilizer and lime recommendations. To collect and submit a sample, contact your local Extension office.
- Weed Identification Clinic, Plant Disease Clinic, and Insect Identification Lab: Each of these services from Virginia Tech can be accessed via your local Extension agent.
